GLORIFIED LORD

The Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor is the central and dominant image. The image also alludes to the Crucifixion, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of the glorified Lord. The white garment represents the Transfiguration (*"his clothes became as white as light"* Mt 17:2). His outstretched arms symbolize the Crucifixion. The Resurrection is also suggested by his garment of glory. The upward movement of the four bands of color and Jesus being lifted from the mount suggest his Ascension into heaven.
