Choosing Baptismal Sponsors (God Parents)

(The Code of Canon Law, #872-874)

Role of Baptismal Sponsors

The role of a baptismal sponsor is, together with the parents, to present the child for baptism and to help the child to live a Christian Life befitting the baptized and faithfully to fulfill the duties inherent in baptism.

Number of Sponsors

There is to be only one male sponsor or one female sponsor, or one of each. The gender of the child has no bearing on the gender of the sponsor.

Qualifications to be Baptismal Sponsor

Sponsors must

- have completed sixteenth year of age*;
- received the sacraments of the Eucharist and Confirmation**;
- lead a life of faith in keeping with the responsibilities taken on.

Christian Witnesses

A baptized person (16 years or older) who belongs to another Christian ecclesial community may serve as a Christian witness of the baptism along with a Catholic sponsor.

- In such a case the confirmed Catholic serves as the sponsor, the non-catholic as a Christian witness.
- The Christian witness should not be someone who left the Catholic Church
- The baptism certificate will indicate the person is a Christian witness rather than an official sponsor.

Notes

*The pastor of St. Mary Parish has the authority to make an exception to the age requirement for just cause.

** The pastor of St. Mary Parish has the authority to make an exception for a person participating in a confirmation program preparing to be confirmed.
